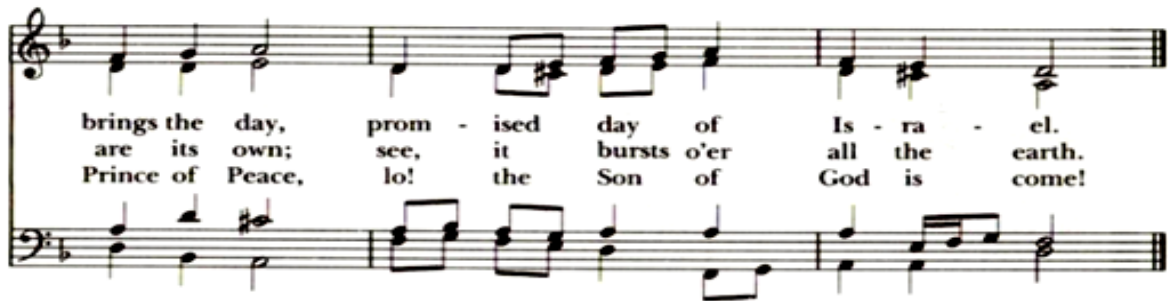

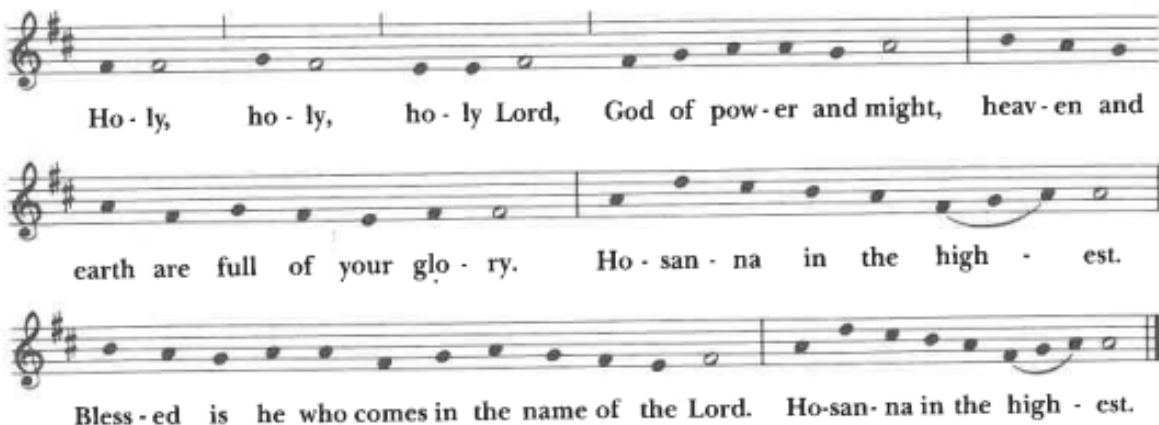
People: Have mercy, Lord, for we are sinners in your sight.

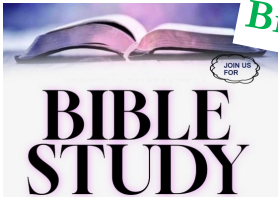




Good Shepherd Hikers December Hike!

On December 20, the Good Shepherd hikers are planning to hike in Cave Creek Regional Park. We will hike the Slate and Quartz trails for approximately 3.5 miles. This trail is moderate because it is rocky in places with some minor ascents and descents. The scenery is spectacular with some unusual cacti, slate and quartz rock formations.

There is a \$7/car entry fee to the park, which is accessed from 32nd street off the Carefree Highway. Once you get into the park, go past the visitor center and turn left onto mountain then turn right onto Tonalita Dr. there is ample parking near the Slate trail head.
